



School Wide Overall ELA








School Wide Overall Math

Teachers will discuss and have lessons around college & career plans, develop organizational skills, implement best teaching practices that include collaboration with peers, team building, etc.






Positivity Project Year 5

Interventions at Reagan



Reagan Elementary MTSS:

- Reagan Elementary School uses a problem solving model called Multi-Tiered System of Support. MTSS is a process designed to address the needs of ALL students and is intended as an early intervention to prevent long-term academic failure. The MTSS Team meets on a regular basis to offer assistance to students, teachers and parents regarding student success here at school.
- ►MTSS is a multi-step process of providing instruction and support to promote the academic and behavioral success of all children. Individual children's progress is monitored and results are used to make decisions about further instruction and intervention.
- ►MTSS is most commonly used in addressing reading, math and behavior, but it can also be used in other areas. The MTSS process is flexible and designed to meet the needs of students.

Academic Interventions Available at Reagan Elementary

Academic Interventions:

Classroom teachers provide Tier 1, Tier 2 and Tier 3 interventions within the classroom for ELA and Math. Additionally, credentialed intervention teacher with a focus on the Math or ELA essential standards/ foundational skills necessary for mastery (Tier 2 or Tier 3).

PLC meetings are focused on tracking and monitoring how students are progressing through the intervention cycle by analyzing data from pre, mid, post assessments.

Intervention is on a 6-week cycle.

- Will be part of the CE Area until new TBEC opens in Fall of 2025.


New Area/TBEC
